office, homing the galgos, events and to all our supporters around the country for all their hard work raising funds throughout the year which enables us to continue our work for the greyhounds and galgos.



#### Trustees' pages

As the Spanish hunting season begins each October, thousands of galgos take to the fields. These elegant, loyal dogs run their hearts out for their hunters. However, when the season ends around January 31st, many are cast aside as they are no longer seen as 'useful'.

Earlier this year, police in Madrid found one young galgo shut away in a dark storeroom, alone, frightened, and surrounded by its own waste. No light, no food, no comfort. Just silence. Sadly, stories like this are all too common. When February arrives, so will a wave of abandonment across Spain.



Recent figures from Fundación Affinity show that more than 292,000 dogs and cats were abandoned in Spain in 2024, an increase from the previous year. Among them are countless galgos.

Despite the introduction of Spain's 2023 Animal Welfare Law, hunting dogs, such as galgos, were controversially excluded from many of its protections; a loophole that continues to leave them vulnerable to neglect and abuse.

And yet, there is hope. Across Spain, local shelters are out there every day rescuing, healing, and rehoming these gentle souls. Some run schools' programmes, helping children develop empathy and compassion for these dogs, planting the seeds of real, lasting change.

Greyhounds in Need is proud to support these incredible people. We help fund shelter facilities, veterinary care, food, education programmes, and safe transport to loving homes across Europe. But we can't do it without you.



We know times are challenging for everyone right now, but your support truly makes a difference. Every donation helps a galgo find safety. Every fundraiser, every conversation, every act of kindness helps shine a light into the dark places where too many galgos are still waiting to be found.

The new puppy block we funded earlier this year at Galgos Rescue Almeria has been a great help to Sandy and her team. The puppies have had great fun socialising together away from the other rescue dogs.

We helped them further this Summer and paid for some awnings to be fitted on the puppy block to create much needed shade for the puppies from the hot Spanish sunshine.

Earlier this year we were approached by a shelter called LovingDogs for some help with the galgos they rescue. They are based in the Cartagena region of Spain and offer a safe home to the dogs they receive, while they look for a warm, lasting home for each of them. We sent them some care packages containing donated dog coats, towels, blankets etc. of which they were truly grateful. We agreed to help them going forward and we have been able to give some funding towards the veterinary costs involved for the galgos they rescue. Here are some photos of the dogs we have helped so far and we look forward to working with them in the future.

#### Free Spanish Hounds: Marching for Spain's hunting dogs

In 2022 we adopted our Galgo, Tapas, from Greyhounds in Need (GIN). Like many other adopters, I followed Spanish shelters on social media and was deeply disturbed by their images and stories of mistreatment. Then in 2023 the Spanish government excluded hunting dogs from Spain's new animal welfare laws. Around the same time, I saw a post about international Galgo marches and asked in the comments if there was one in the UK. The answer was no.

I soon realised I wasn't alone in thinking the UK should join these marches. Through social media connections, I got in touch with a few others. We were introduced to Teresa, the international coordinator for NAC, the Spanish animal rights movement that organises peaceful protests for the Spanish hunting dogs. Not long after, Heather, Gem and the Hope for Podencos team and I came together to establish **Free Spanish Hounds**.

None of us had ever organised a protest before, let alone one involving dogs! Our top priority was to ensure the safety of the people and the dogs. We were lucky to have a strong community of adopters and animal lovers who offered advice and practical help: from graphic design and PR to stewarding, photography, and even custom vests and collars for the dogs. GIN and Project Galgo joined Hope for Podencos as supporting charities, helping us spread the word.

Our first peaceful protest took place in London on 3 February 2024. Around 200 people and 150 dogs gathered outside the Spanish Embassy, where Teresa read NAC's manifesto. We then marched through central London, via Trafalgar Square to Charing Cross. Many dogs wore the Spanish colours, not as a celebration, but to distinguish them as survivors of Spain's hunting culture. Along the way, people stopped to ask about our cause, giving us the chance to raise awareness directly.

Encouraged by the support we received in 2024, and responding to requests for protests beyond London, we launched an appeal for volunteers. Thanks to their efforts, on 1 February 2025 marches took place simultaneously in London, Manchester, and Glasgow. More than 400 people and around 300 dogs took part. While Podencos had been the majority in our first protest, I was personally pleased to see more Galgos joining in this year!

Our movement is growing. Each march brings more support with people across the UK wanting to get involved. In 2026, we will be expanding again, allowing our supporters from the South West of England to join: London, Glasgow, Manchester, and Exeter. The marches will take place over two days: Saturday 31st January in Manchester, Glasgow, and Exeter, and Sunday 1st February in London.

#### Marching for Galgos and Podenco rights

In both February 2024 and 2025, London joined many other cities with a peaceful march against Spain's continued tradition of hunting with Galgos and Podencos. I was determined to attend with Hendrik, who I adopted from GIN in 2022. I wanted to lend our voices and paws to the cause and help raise awareness of the cruelty these gentle dogs endure.

Before the first march, I admit I felt a little apprehensive about bringing Hendrik. He can be nervous around unfamiliar dogs and people, and he had never been to London before. To prepare, we made a "practice run" a week before the main event, travelling by train with his friend Tango and his hoomum to central London for a relaxed walk. To my relief, both boys enjoyed the outing and took the bustling city in stride.



When the day of the march arrived, my worries melted away. The atmosphere was warm, welcoming, and incredibly respectful. Organisers and fellow participants were mindful of nervous dogs, giving them plenty of space and ensuring everyone felt safe and comfortable. Hendrik, Tango, his hoomum and I met many other beautiful Galgos and Podencos, each with their own story. We also had countless conversations with curious passers-by. Many people stopped to ask about the breeds and why so many of us were walking together through the heart of London, giving us the chance to share the plight of these dogs.

Attending these marches has been an inspiring experience, a reminder of the power of community and compassion. Hendrik and I are already looking forward to joining again in 2026 and I encourage anyone considering it, whether you



have a Galgo, a Podenco, or simply a love for animals, to come along. Together, we can keep shining a light on this important issue and help create a kinder world for these wonderful dogs.

#### Education

We recently produced 5 giant floor jigsaw puzzles for GDS and SOS Galgos. There are 5 different designs focusing on galgos and their needs in a home. The puzzles range from 8-24 pieces, so each puzzle gets slightly harder. We are sure they will be a great hit with the school children and maybe the staff at the centres too.







At GIN, one of our key focuses is supporting shelters in delivering meaningful educational experiences for schools and



youth organisations. We aim to develop children's understanding, encourage empathy, and raise awareness about galgos and animal welfare through engaging resources, hands-on activities, and thoughtful take-home gifts.

GIN supports rescue shelters by funding education classrooms and equipment, transportation for school visits, and the provision of an education programme through a dedicated website.

https://education.greyhoundsinneed.co.uk/ provides learning materials and activities all about galgos. Supporting cross-curricular learning in schools, and available in both Spanish and English (so UK teachers can use them too), learn about

rescue shelters, what animals need, compare the life of a pet galgo vs a working galgo, make face masks and puppets, create a snuffle mat, and more! Importantly, it supports the rescue shelters working on the ground with children and young people, giving them free access to a variety of activities. And GIN ensures the shelters have something the children can take away wristbands and water bottles are always popular!


Orion 27/12/16-16/06/25

It is with a very sad heart that I have to write my beloved Orion passed away on 16 June 2025 internal bleeding and stomach cancer.

 Orion came into my life in August 2018. I had moved to France in November 2017 with my husband. I had promised myself that I would share my home with another galgo. The first dog that came to us was Red, our Podenca. We brought her home 1.12.17.

I saw Orion on the GIN FB page and he was so handsome and he was the last galgo to be left in his group. Nobody was interested in him. I called the office and said I would like to have

him. GIN accepted my offer so he became my boy. After his journey from Spain to UK he now had to travel back to France. He was a well travelled dog. We drove up to Normandy to collect him. We stopped overnight and next day down to South West France where we lived. There on neutral ground he k met Red and they got on well with each other. He had a lovely temperament such a sweet nature. He put up with Red being the boss! He loved coming into the bedroom if I was napping or ill and get on the bed to be near me.





Every year, usually at Xmas we would drive to Empuriabrava, resort in Spain. He loved going on walks around the town, looking at yachts in the port and going to the beach and going into the water. He even met some other rescued galgos.

I was in the UK when he became ill. It was so sudden and unexpected. On the Sunday before my return he wouldn't eat or go out. Early Monday morning he fell off the sofa and was immediately taken to the vets. They were very

good but nothing could be done. They kept him comfortable until I had landed in the afternoon. went straight to him. When I saw him he looked so tired and couldn't even wag his tail. I made the heartbreaking decision to let him go. He is now with Juno and Justine everyone healthy just waiting for Mummy to arrive.

🕊 I had already made the decision to return permanently to the UK next year. Red and I will drive 💃 back but the boy will be with us as I promised I would take them home. Orion's ashes will travel with us. He will never leave me now.


with Meningomyelitis and lumbar disc fusion. He recovered but his

If you pay Income Tax at the higher or additional rate and want to receive the additional tax relief due to you, you must include all your Gift Aid donations on your Self Assessment tax return or ask HM Revenue and

Customs to adjust your tax code.


5th Category, Best in Show. We knew the other winners, and knew we were going along for the experience rather than an expectation of an award in that.



#### Vet's Corner

#### Blood Pressure Measurements in Dogs: Why They Matter

Just like humans, dogs can experience high or low blood pressure, which can affect their overall health. Blood pressure measurement is an essential diagnostic tool that helps veterinarians detect underlying health issues and prevent complications. Regular monitoring can be especially important for senior dogs and those with chronic conditions.

#### What is Blood Pressure in Dogs?

Blood pressure is the force of blood pushing against the walls of arteries as the heart pumps. It is measured in millimeters of mercury (mmHg) and consists of two values:

- Systolic pressure: The pressure when the heart contracts and pumps blood.
- Diastolic pressure: The pressure when the heart relaxes between beats.

For dogs, normal systolic blood pressure typically ranges from 110 to 160 mmHg, while diastolic pressure is less commonly measured.

#### Why is Measuring Blood Pressure Important?

Abnormal blood pressure can indicate serious health conditions. Measuring it helps:

- Detect high blood pressure (hypertension) or low blood pressure (hypotension).
- · Monitor dogs with conditions like kidney disease, heart disease, or hormonal disorders.
- · Evaluate the effects of medication.
- Prevent complications like organ damage, vision loss, and strokes.

#### Causes of High and Low Blood Pressure in Dogs

#### High Blood Pressure (Hypertension)

Common causes include:

- · Kidney disease (most common cause)
- · Cushing's disease (hyperadrenocorticism)
- Diabetes
- · Heart disease
- Hyperthyroidism (rare in dogs)
- Pain, stress, or anxiety
- Shock from trauma or infection
- · Anaesthesia complications



#### Low Blood Pressure (Hypotension)

Potential causes include:

- · Severe blood loss or dehydration
- Heart failure
- Shock from trauma or infection
- Anaesthesia complications

#### How is Blood Pressure Measured in Dogs?

Veterinarians use non-invasive methods similar to those for humans but adapted for dogs. The most common techniques include:

- 1. Doppler Ultrasound Method
- A small cuff is placed around a limb or tail.
- A handheld Doppler probe detects blood flow sounds.
- The cuff is inflated and slowly deflated to determine systolic pressure.
- 2. Oscillometric Method
- An automated device inflates and deflates the cuff, detecting pressure changes.
- · More useful for medium to large dogs but less reliable in small dogs.

#### When Should a Dog's Blood Pressure Be Checked?

- Senior dogs (7+ years): Regular checks as part of a wellness exam.
- · Dogs with kidney, heart, or endocrine diseases: Frequent monitoring.
- · Dogs showing symptoms like blindness, seizures, or lethargy.
- · Before surgery: Ensures safe anesthesia administration.

#### Managing Abnormal Blood Pressure

- For high blood pressure: Treatment may include medications (e.g., amlodipine), dietary changes, and managing underlying conditions.
- For low blood pressure: IV fluids, medications, or treating the root cause may be necessary.

#### **Conclusion**

Blood pressure measurement is a simple yet valuable tool for monitoring your dog's health. Regular checks can help detect problems early and prevent serious complications. If your dog has a condition that affects blood pressure, talk to your veterinarian about routine monitoring to ensure a long, healthy life.
